

Hi my name is Earon Vollmar, I'm 21 years old and I've been bowling since I was 2 years old. My love of bowling was started at an early age by my parents and my grandparents. I watched the PBA at my grandparent's house every Saturday when it was on ABC and on Sundays we would all go bowling. I started bowling in my first league when I was 11 years old and around the age of 14 I started to take bowling more seriously. I joined the GTBPA Junior All Stars Traveling League in Toledo, Oh. We traveled around the area bowling at all the different centers that were around our area and along with that came much experience. I competed in that league from the age of 14 till I was 19. Along with bowling in my travel league I also competed in many youth tournaments all over the country. I competed in monthly tournaments called the JTBA (Junior Tournament Bowling Association of Ohio), Keystone Tournaments, and many other tournaments in my youth career. I also competed 4 years in the prestigious Junior Gold Tournament. I've won a good hand full of tournaments ranging from singles tournaments, to doubles tournaments and team tournaments. One of my most memorial tournament wins in my youth career was when I won the Ohio State Youth singles tournament back in 2006. It was a 6 game set and I shot 795 for my first 3 games. When I moved up into the adult leagues in 2009 I joined a prestigious Traveling Classic League that has been one of the best competitive leagues in the Toledo area. For my first year in the league I averaged 220, which is I was very happy with because most of the shots we bowl on are left over from the league before us, to say the least they tended had the potential to play very difficult. I also continued to compete in a multitude of tournaments as well. 2009 was also the first year that I competed in the USBC Open Championship Tournament. The tournament took place in Las Vegas that year and it was an awesome experience but I was a little over come by my nerves and that hurt my overall performance. While my first year in the adult leagues and competition was completely different from my junior career, I gained a great amount of experience that would only make me better. In my second year I also competed in the Traveling Classic again and ended the year with a respectable 222 average. I also competed in many tournaments again and placed fairly high in a few of them. I also competed in my second USBC Open Tournament which was in Reno in 2010. I started with a 666 in my team event, 697 in my doubles event, and finished with a 247-300-264 for an 811 in singles and an all events score of 2174. With that I'm tied for 2nd in singles and tied for 6th in all events as of 6/11/10. All of the events I used Storm equipment and I used the Furious for my 300 and 800 set in singles. My first Storm balls were the Power Charge and the Big Hit back from 2003 and ever since then I have loved the type of roll that Storm equipment gives me. Over the years I have had a multitude of Storm and Roto Grip equipment and I am continuously adding to my arsenal. I am currently working in a pro shop in Toledo, Ohio called Shot Makers Pro Shop. I've been employed there since I was 16 years old and I have enjoyed learning all about how to lay a bowling ball out and how different cores and cover stocks affect the overall roll of the ball. I was home schooled for all of my high school career and I graduated in 2006. I'm currently enrolled at Owens Community College and I am going to get a Business Management degree so that one day I might be able to open a pro shop of my own.
