

Bowling to me has always been a source of great joy. It has been a constant in my life, my entire life. My grandmother bowled, my parents bowled, and I bowl. I started bowling at four years old. As a child, I always look up to the late great Earl Anthony because he was a left-handed bowler as am I. I did not have much coaching as a child because no one was able to help the left-handed child. That did not stop me from learning as much as I could on my own and becoming the best bowler I could.

I have been a part of as many as four leagues at a time. This became my demise as a left-handed bowler. In November of 2006, I injured my knee bowling. I took a week off to recuperate and soon realized that if I wanted to continue bowling, I had to switch hands. Around late November of 2006, I started bowling right handed. It took about a month for me to get the footing down and arm swing down so it was a fluid motion. By the end of the season, I realized I was much more consistent with right than my left hand.

I have since blown away any left hand accomplishments I had made. My highest book average for my right hand is 205. My highest book average for my left hand is 196. I bowled one 300 hundred game left-handed, unfortunately it was not during league play. Right-handed, I have won two eleven-in-a-row plaques. I have had 700 series left and right handed. I currently have both hands sanctioned. I bowl two leagues right handed and one league left handed.

Injuring my knee could have been a game ender, but instead I made it a game changer.

I believe I am the next bowling Prodigy because I am one of few ambidextrous bowlers. Not many people can say they can bowl with both hands and still hold a 200 hundred, plus or minus a few pins, with both hands. When most people would have given up the sport, I decided to push my limits further than they ever have been for love of the sport.

I currently bowl with two storms and a Columbia. They are all reactive and particle balls. The balls are drilled for medium and heavy oil. I do not use a spare ball. I am a one-ball bowler. I have been successful compared to my own standards in my leagues. I believe with the correct equipment and professional guidance I could improve my game to be a contender in the Amateur Bowling Tournament.

Bowling has been a part of my life for my whole life so far. I would like to continue to improve upon my game and excel in the sport of bowling. I am always trying to improve my techniques and test my abilities against other bowlers. Bowling is an important sport to me and I would love the opportunity to speak with a professional to improve my game.
